Hi Palitja and Luke

Apologies for the delay in getting back to you, myself and my colleague Rose O'Sullivan from our ACH Assessments team have reviewed the Response to Submissions and revised studies and provide the following comments:

Aboriginal cultural heritage and archaeology

- We note and support the new 'Connecting with Country' chapter 9.1 included in the Revised Draft Design Code v.2.
- We support the measures outlined in section 9.2.1 of the Revised Draft Design Code v.2, in particular, the need to consider archaeological test excavation at an early stage of planning should any ground disturbance be proposed in the identified areas of potential archaeological deposit (PAD). Conducting any necessary test excavation at an early stage provides the best opportunity to protect and conserve Aboriginal cultural heritage sites and values.
- We also support design measures in 9.2.1 of the Revised Draft Design Code v.2 to preserve view lines between recorded shelter site 45-6-2960 and Port Jackson.
- Our previous comments in relation to Aboriginal cultural heritage (dated 27 August 2021) are largely reflected in the Revised Draft Design Code (although not explicitly referenced in the Response to Submissions).

Non-Aboriginal heritage and archaeology

- In our previous advice we recommended that further assessment of the 'Wharf-front warehouse' at 1-3 Bank Street, Pyrmont should be undertaken to determine the significance of the building and inform potential listing and management measures. We note that City Plan Heritage has indicated that this building was assessed as having minimum local level heritage significance.
- In our previous advice we also recommend that an historical archaeological assessment be prepared to establish the potential and significance of these remains and appropriate management measures, and that this should be undertaken to inform final designs prior to the commencement of development in the precinct. We note that City Plan Heritage recommended that further detailed archaeological studies will need to be undertaken for each development site as part of the future applications.
- As noted in our previous advice there is a local heritage item 'Escarpment face from former quarry "Saunders' Quarry", listed as item I1199 under Sydney Local Environmental Plan 2012 (LEP). As Local heritage is protected under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* and under Council LEPs, Council is the consent authority, and the assessment and consideration of impacts on this Local heritage item rests with City of Sydney Council.

Overall, we consider that the Response to Submissions addresses the matters raised in our previous advice. If you have any questions about the above, please let Rose or me know.
