is of the view that if the Special flood considerations clause is to be implemented across the state, that it should be included in the Standard Instrument—Principal Local Environmental Plan, rather than State Environmental Planning Policy (Resilience and Hazards) 2021.
Clause 5.22 of the Standard Instrument—Principal Local Environmental Plan is currently optional, and provides flexibility for individual Council's to select appropriate land uses to be included as 'sensitive or hazardous development'. Should clause 5.22 become mandatory would like the current flexibility regarding the types of sensitive and hazardous land uses to remain a matter for Council to nominate.
nas no objection to the draft Shelter-in-Place guideline, although understands that this is not proposed to become a statutory planning document. If adopted, would need to give further consideration as to whether the guideline should be incorporated into for managing floodplains.
